



The SITE of LONDON.

REMARKS- The River at these Forks is two Chains Broad about two feet deep where Rapid, and about four feet and a half where Still water- The water rises in the Spring of the Year from Six to Seven feet. The Plains are high and dry, with narrow Flats skirting the River- The greatest body of water runs thro the new formed passage at the neck of the Island, which seems formerly to have been a peninsula - On the Island, the land is level and low, in the Spring it is overflowed.
